You are cordially invited to attend a reception for the students immediately following the recital in the parlor, which can be located at the front of the church, behind the nave. Exit from either door near the chancel and turn left. The parlor will be on the right.

The Myers Park Presbyterian Church organ was built by the world-renowned Canadian organ-builder Casavant-Frères in 1961. The organ features 77 ranks and 112 stops over four manuals and pedal. The electro-pneumatic action allows for movable consoles that permit the organist to hear the organ from a variety of locations in the chancel. The four-manual chancel console was installed June 2008, completing a significant rebuild project conducted over the past twenty years.
